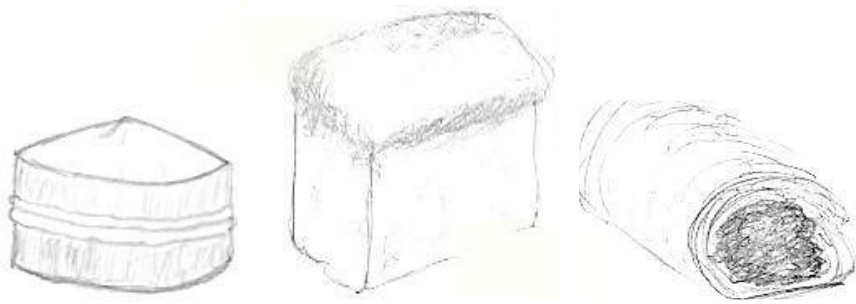

EXHIBITING TIPS

It's the taking part that counts but some of the tips below we hope may help:

1. Judges do take into account size and number – you will be disqualified if your exhibit is bigger or smaller than the Schedule states.
2. **Please also see specific rules under each section.**
3. Please leave the tops on carrots and beetroots and the stalks on tomatoes, beans, cucumbers and courgettes.
4. 'Dressed' means tops turned over and tied with raffia or twine.
5. If sand is used to support e.g.; shallots – it must be completely dry.
6. Remove some of the rough, dry skin on onions (but not too much).
7. Leave the stalks on raspberries, apples, pears etc.
8. When entering cut flowers please note that any buds present will be counted as flowers.
9. A 'specimen rose' is one that is $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ open – it should be fresh and free from blemishes.
10. A 'full blown rose' is one that is completely open – it should be fresh and free from blemishes.
11. Cookery – when size is specified you will be disqualified if your exhibit is not to size.
