12.	Ipswich Northern Route Consultation  Many local parishes have held public meeting. Charsfield sent a letter to all parishioners and have had three replies. We hope many people have submitted their own comments on line.	
	It was suggested the consultation might be slightly flawed as it just asks for opinions on the best route but gives no good reason for actually providing a northern route. It was also suggested that if SCC had to fund it themselves they might not go ahead?	
	The general feeling is that the Northern Route should be considered alongside Sizewell C.	
	The Consultation ends on 13 <sup>th</sup> September.
