

- 1. Points to be awarded: FIRST (5 points), SECOND (3 points), THIRD (1 point).
- 2. In the event of a tie, the number of 1st, 2nd and 3rd places will be considered when placing the cup.
- All exhibits must be in place by 10.15am on Saturday 27th July 2023. The village hall will be open from 8am on show day. No exhibits are to be removed until after the raffle and prize giving.
- 4. <u>All exhibits to be grown or produced by the exhibitor, unless</u> otherwise stated.
- 5. One entry per person, per class. Entries will be accepted from individuals only (i.e. no joint entries).
- 6. Prizes may be withheld if the committee or judges consider there to be too few entries in a class, or if the entries are considered substandard.
- 7. Judging is fully anonymised and the judge's decision is final.
- Entry by completed Entry Form and Payment. ENTRY FORMS WILL BE RECEIVED IN CHARSFIELD VILLAGE HALL BETWEEN 7PM AND 9PM ON TUESDAY 23rd JULY, 2024. NO LATE ENTRIES CAN BE ACCEPTED.
- 9. All entry cards will be completed on entries night and taken away by the exhibitors, to bring to the show on show day unless otherwise agreed.
- 10. Prize giving and raffle at 4pm, exhibits to be cleared after.
- 11. All exhibits, personal property etc., shall be left at the risk of the exhibitor and the Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.

EXHIBITING TIPS

It's the taking part that counts but some of the tips below we hope may help:

- Judges do take into account size and number you will be disqualified if your exhibit is bigger or smaller than the Schedule states.
- 2. Please also see specific rules under each section.
- 3. Please leave the tops on carrots and beetroots and the stalks on tomatoes, beans, cucumbers and courgettes.
- 4. 'Dressed' means tops turned over and tied with raffia or twine.
- 5. If sand is used to support e.g.; shallots it must be completely dry.
- 6. Remove some of the rough, dry skin on onions (but not too much).
- 7. Leave the stalks on raspberries, apples, pears etc.
- 8. When entering cut flowers please note that any buds present will be counted as flowers.
- 9. A 'specimen rose' is one that is ½ to ¾ open it should be fresh and free from blemishes.
- 10. A 'full blown rose' is one that is completely open it should be fresh and free from blemishes.
- 11. Cookery when size is specified you will be disqualified if your exhibit is not to size.
