Where can I walk?

There are a fair number of footpaths around the village and the quieter roads make for good walking too. Unfortunately, there is currently no public access land in the village.

With the aid of this map you should be able to plan a variety of circular walks taking in some great views of the Potsford Valley.

Parking is available at the recreation ground in Chapel Lane, just behind the Baptist Chapel.

All of the roads, bridleways and footpaths are available to walkers. On the map, the pedestrian routes (other than roads) are marked in green.

Wildlife conservation

With the introduction of wildlife conservation programmes, field margins are being maintained as habitats for ground nesting birds, such as Skylarks, and the small mammals which are helping to restore populations of owls and other birds of prey.

These "buffers" look tempting as walking routes but the species that depend on them are very easily disturbed by people and dogs. Eggs and young birds die very quickly without the protection of their parents. Please help them by keeping to the marked footpaths.

You don't have to keep your dog on a lead on public footpaths but it does have to be under control so that it doesn't disturb farm animals or wildlife.

Hints for an enjoyable walk:

- Be safe plan ahead and follow any signs
- Leave gates and property as you find them
- Protect plants and animals, take your litter home
- Keep dogs under close control, even on footpaths
- Consider other people
- Take your time, admire the countryside!
